



# Community-Driven Oral Health Initiatives in Rural Tanzania: A Twelve-Month Impact Assessment on Dental Health Status

## Abstract

Rural areas in Tanzania often lack access to comprehensive dental healthcare services, leading to poor dental health among children. This study aims to evaluate the effectiveness of community-led oral hygiene initiatives. A mixed-method approach, including pre-and post-intervention surveys and clinical assessments, was employed. Data collection occurred across four villages in Tanzania. Initial findings suggest an improvement in tooth decay incidence by 30% among participants compared to controls ( $p < 0.05$ ). Themes included increased fluoride awareness and improved oral hygiene practices. The intervention appears effective, with notable improvements in dental health status. Further research should explore long-term sustainability of these programmes and their scalability across Tanzania. Treatment effect was estimated with  $\text{text}\{\text{logit}\}(\pi) = \beta_0 + \beta^T p X_i$ , and uncertainty reported using confidence-interval based inference.
