



Digital Literacy Pedagogy in Lagos Public Libraries: A Framework for Senior Citizens' Engagement and Usage Studies

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Abstract

Digital literacy training programmes for senior citizens in Lagos public libraries have gained attention as a means to bridge the digital divide and promote inclusion in urban planning and transportation.
