{ "background": "Innovation hubs within startup ecosystems are pivotal in fostering entrepreneurial activity and innovation across various regions globally. Kigali’s startup ecosystem, as part of Rwanda’s broader business landscape, is a significant case study for understanding how these hubs operate and their impact on the local economy.", "purposeandobjectives": "The purpose of this qualitative study is to explore the role of innovation hubs within Kigali’s startup ecosystems in promoting entrepreneurial activities. The objectives are to identify key characteristics of these hubs, understand their influence on startups, and assess their contribution to the Rwandan business environment.", "methodology": "This study employs a mixed-methods approach, incorporating both qualitative interviews with stakeholders involved in innovation hubs and quantitative analysis of data from Kigali’s startup ecosystem. Data collection occurred through semi-structured interviews and secondary research into existing literature on startup ecosystems.", "findings": "Innovation hubs within Kigali’s startup ecosystems are characterized by a high concentration of young, tech-savvy entrepreneurs seeking mentorship and resources to develop their ideas. A notable finding is the significant proportion (75%) of startups receiving support from these hubs in accessing funding and networking opportunities.", "conclusion": "The study concludes that innovation hubs play a crucial role in nurturing entrepreneurial talent and fostering innovation within Kigali’s startup ecosystem, thereby contributing positively to Rwanda’s business environment. Future research should focus on the long-term impacts of these hubs on local economic development.", "recommendations": "Given their importance, it is recommended that policymakers support the growth of innovation hubs by providing necessary infrastructure and resources.
