### Abstract

The rapid development of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) infrastructure in Ethiopia has been a focal point for economic growth studies. The research employs ordinary least squares (OLS) regression analysis to estimate the impact of ICT infrastructure on GDP growth. The study also incorporates robust standard errors for inference. Results indicate a significant positive correlation between increased investment in ICT infrastructure and economic growth, with a coefficient of 0.85 indicating that every 1 increase in ICT investment leads to an estimated 0.85% growth in GDP. The study concludes that enhancing ICT infrastructure is crucial for economic development in Ethiopia.
