## Abstract

Trade Winds Across Mozambique explores the impact of trade liberalization on crop yields and livelihoods in urban settings of Mozambique. Urban agriculture in Mozambique shows a significant decline in crop yields following trade liberalization policies, with particular emphasis on maize production. The review underscores the need for more supportive agricultural policies that consider urban agro-systems' unique challenges. Policy makers are advised to integrate urban agriculture into national development plans and provide targeted support to small-scale farmers in cities.
