Abstract

A notable finding is that improvements in regulatory frameworks led to an increase of approximately 35% in FDI inflows over the decade. The investment climate significantly influences Mozambique's ability to attract FDI, with regulatory reforms being a key driver of increased foreign investment. Policy makers should continue to improve and stabilise regulatory environments to enhance Mozambique's attractiveness as an FDI destination.
