## ABSTRACT

**Background:** Emergency care systems in sub-Saharan Africa face significant challenges in resource allocation and outcome measurement. Current evaluations often rely on cross-sectional data, which fail to capture temporal dynamics and unobserved heterogeneity, limiting the robustness of policy-relevant evidence.

**Purpose and objectives:** This protocol outlines a methodological framework for applying panel-data econometrics to estimate the effect of systemic factors on clinical outcomes in emergency units. The primary objective is to establish a replicable model for quantifying the impact of variables such as staffing ratios, drug availability, and diagnostic capacity on patient mortality and morbidity.
