Abstract

Mobile health clinics have been introduced in remote communities to address healthcare needs effectively. Comparative analysis using qualitative and quantitative data from both regions. Malaria treatment success rates were notably higher in East Java's mobile health clinics compared to Morocco's clinics (75% vs. 60%). East Java's mobile health clinics demonstrated better community engagement, indicated by a 40% increase in clinic visits. Enhance community participation and training programmes for healthcare workers to improve outcomes further.
