Abstract

A specific result is the establishment of an interdisciplinary research group dedicated to exploring African philosophical contributions. The review concludes by affirming the importance of integrating African philosophical thought into global ethical discussions and underscores the need for further empirical studies that can provide a more robust understanding of these influences in Seychelles. Future researchers should consider conducting comparative analyses to assess how different regions within Africa, including Seychelles, have responded differently to African philosophical ideas. Additionally, there is a call for greater dialogue between scholars from diverse cultural backgrounds to better understand the global impact of African philosophy on ethical debates.
