Abstract

The Sahel region of Chad is facing increasing climate variability and extreme weather events, posing significant challenges to human security. Climate-induced displacement has reached alarming proportions, with over 30% of affected households experiencing significant disruptions to their livelihoods in recent years. The analysis highlights the urgent need for comprehensive climate adaptation strategies that integrate socio-economic resilience and community engagement. Policy recommendations include enhanced early warning systems, improved access to credit and market opportunities, and increased investment in drought-resistant crops.
