Abstract

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) has become a critical aspect of business operations worldwide, influencing corporate behaviour towards societal and environmental impacts. The research employs a quantitative survey approach involving responses from 150 multinational companies across various sectors of the Angolan economy. A notable finding is that 72% of surveyed firms incorporate CSR activities in their business strategies, indicating an increasing trend towards responsible corporate behaviour. The results highlight the need for further development and alignment of CSR policies with local societal expectations and regulatory frameworks.
