Abstract

Rwanda's land law reforms have been a focal point in discussions about tenure security and legal frameworks for agricultural land. This analysis employs a qualitative approach, examining legislative documents, academic literature, and interviews with stakeholders to assess reform implementation. Significant shifts were observed towards more formalized land registration systems, leading to increased confidence among farmers regarding long-term land use rights. The reforms have notably enhanced tenure security but also highlighted challenges in equitable distribution of benefits across different socioeconomic groups. Future policy should prioritise strengthening legal enforcement and ensuring comprehensive coverage of all rural areas.
