| Abstract

This study addresses a current research gap in Medicine concerning Indigenous Knowledge Systems in Medicine Practice in São Tomé and Príncipe. The objective is to clarify key debates, identify practical implications, and outline a focused agenda for scholarship and policy. The analysis indicates persistent structural constraints alongside emerging local innovations; however, evidence remains uneven across contexts and sectors. The paper argues for context-specific approaches and stronger empirical foundations in future research.
