### Abstract

Telehealth access in remote areas has been a focus for improving chronic disease management through remote monitoring programmes. Not applicable to this review article as it focuses on existing studies rather than conducting new empirical research. Remote monitoring via telehealth showed a significant reduction ( $P < 0.05$ ) in healthcare costs by

23 per patient annually, with a confidence interval of (18, 28). The review highlights the potential for telehealth
